### Cadarache event – Winter 2015

*This note is addressed to the participants of the Cadarache event in February 2015. Please, read carefully. It gives you important information about your stay with CEA.*

#### Dates

Master Sciences de la Fusion : 9 February – 4 March 2015 22 students (17 FCM + 5PTF)

Erasmus Mundus Fusion-EP: 9-20 February 2015 16 students

During these weeks, you will be hosted by the Institute for Magnetic Confinement Fusion Research at Cadarache. Although you will still be enrolled in your home University/ School, you will be considered as CEA staff during your stay at Cadarache. This includes a lot of advantages and a few constraints that we would like to review with you now, together with the organisation of the scientific programme.

#### Practical details

##### **1. Accommodation**

Accommodation is organized for you in 'Résidence La Licorne de Haute-Provence', Chemin des Riayes, 04800 Gréoux-les-Bains ([www.residence-la-licorne.com](http://www.residence-la-licorne.com)) in shared apartments (3 students/ 2 bedrooms apartments). The apartments are fully furnished (with bed sheets, bath towels), a wifi internet connection is available simultaneously for all. You will also be permitted access to an indoor swimming pool and a small fitness center.

##### **2. Local transportation**

A bus will take you every morning at 7:45am at 'La Licorne'. Please don't be late. You will have no other chance to come to Cadarache later by public transportation.

Your bus will leave Cadarache every day at 4:40pm.

##### **3. General rules**

Gréoux-les-Bains is a small thermal bath & holiday resort 10km from Cadarache. It is a very quiet setting, most particularly at this period of the year. Nearby Manosque is also a small, quiet town. As our future nuclear engineers, you are expected to be, not only brilliant scientists, but also 'reliable' persons, concerned by safety. You are expected to behave so. Please, be respectful of the local environment that is offered to you. Do not underestimate the impact your behavior might have on the 'credibility' of our research, and 'acceptability' of nuclear energy. Any misbehavior will be taken seriously by the Head of the Institute, for immediate and appropriate response.
